

Adoption versus Guardianship

	Adoption	Guardianship
What is it?	 Creates new parent-child relationship between adopter and adoptee As if the adoptee were born to the adopter 	 Gives guardian legal authority to make long- term decisions concerning child's welfare, education, discipline, medical care, etc.
What rights will the birth parents retain?	 Birth parents do not retain rights Pre-adoptive parent and biological parent/relative may enter into a judicially enforceable post-adoption contact ("PAC") agreement Adoptive parents may allow the child to see whomever they deem appropriate 	 Parental rights intact, not terminated Guardian has right to make major decisions Parent retains ability to demonstrate parental fitness and to seek modification and custody Parents can move the court to change the provisions of the guardianship order
What happens to the neglect case?	Closed by court	Open but dormant after guardianship order
Can this custody arrangement be modified in the future?	 No – Final decree of adoption can't be modified unless there is a procedural or jurisdictional defect Motion filed within one year following the decree Decree may be vacated in extreme cases after 1 yr. Adopted child can't reenter foster care after age 18 	 Yes – If there is substantial and material change in the child's circumstances and modification is in the child's best interest Child who exits foster care to guardianship can't reenter foster care after age 18
What cash benefits can the child receive?	 Subsidy available until age 21 Subsidy rate generally is the same as foster care board rate 	 Subsidy available until age 21 Subsidy rate generally is the same as foster care board rate
Is college financial aid available?	 Child may be eligible for federal and state programs depending on age left foster care DC Tuition Assistance Grant (DCTAG) grants of up to \$10,000 toward the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition at public colleges and universities throughout the US 	 Child may be eligible for federal and state programs depending on age left foster care DC Tuition Assistance Grant (DCTAG) grants of up to \$10,000 toward the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition at public colleges and universities throughout

What other benefits will I receive?	 Child will be eligible for D.C. Medicaid Adoptive parent may be eligible for tax credits Adoption credit, child care credit, child tax credit, earned income tax credit, etc. The adoptive parent may also be eligible for a dependent exemption 	 Child will be eligible for D.C. Medicaid Guardian may be eligible for tax credits Child care credit, child tax credit, earned income tax credit, etc. May also be eligible for dependent exemption
